Gallup Lake Park in Ann Arbor, MI; was named after Eli Gallup

**Eli Gallup was the City Park Superintendent for Ann Arbor, Michigan in 1919, and spent 38 years in that position, expanding the city's park system. The city bought Barton Dam, Argo Dam, Dixboro Dam and Superior Dam, along with their ponds and adjacent river banks - more than 945 acres - from Detroit Edison Electric Company. Much of the Huron River corridor has since been developed into parkland, including the large park named Gallup Park.**
